




BOARD OF DIRECTORS June 2018-June 2019



The Board of Directors manage the business and affairs of the Society pursuant to the Society's bylaws. Board members are nominated, and are elected by the membership in person or by proxy at the General Membership meeting each May. Board members are elected for a two-year term and meet at least four times in a calendar year.



LINFORD MAGAHA, SR., PRESIDENT

Lin has been an active Millbrook member for over 30 years, serving in several leadership positions within the Society, including President and Treasurer. Lin is a lifelong resident of Hatboro. Yerkes Museum and Archives, which Millbrook manages for the Hatboro Baptist Church, and is the repository for protecting and displaying local artifacts and manuscripts.

He initiated Millbrook's archaeology program and taught archaeology field schools at Penn State University, Abington, has given lectures at various institutions, and presented programs for students elementary through high school. David is a lifelong Hatboro resident and is retired from 30 years' service in the U.S. Government. He has published many articles on history, a book on family history, and continues researching and writing about local history.

JAMES MACCARONI, BOARD MEMBER-AT-LARGE


